

Ayr Creek Laguer Investigation

Ayr Creek Lagoon has high environmental values, but the natural wetting and drying cycle and associated vegetation growth and decomposition can result in the release of strong odours during the summer months.

Bass Coast Shire Council has engaged independent consultants Riverness Pty Ltd and estuary expert Dr. Jan Barton, to work with the local community, the West Gippsland Catchment Management Authority and the Environment Protection Agency to investigate the causes of the odour and propose actions to manage the issue.


